Hanan Amin Mohamed is an Assistant Professor of Economics at the Faculty of International Business and Humanities at Egypt-Japan University of Science and Technology, a position she has held since November 2021. She also serves as a member of the Regional and International Affairs Council at the same institution.

Prior to this, she was an Assistant Professor at the Department of Economics- English Section, Faculty of Commerce and Business Administration, Helwan University from October 2017 to October 2021. At Helwan University, she also held roles as a Lecturer Assistant (April 2013 - September 2017) and Demonstrator (June 2009 - March 2013) in the Department of Economics- English Section. Additionally, she was the Head of the Partnerships and Networks Division (PND) at the International Relations Office from September 2017 to October 2021.

Dr. Amin holds a PhD in Economics from Helwan University (July 2015 - August 2017), with her thesis focusing on "The Impact of Banking Sector Development on Economic Growth in Egypt". She also earned a Master's Degree in Economics from Helwan University (October 2010 - January 2013) and a Bachelor's Degree in Economics from Helwan University (September 2004 - June 2008).

Her academic activities include participating in a fellowship program in Japan (July-August 2023), presenting on "Islamic Fintech: Towards Financial Inclusion" at the Kazan Summit in Russia (July 2021), and delivering virtual lectures on the Egyptian economy for Tashkent State University for Oriental Studies (October 2020). She has presented numerous papers at international conferences on topics such as the impact of digitalization in the energy sector, digital transformation post-COVID-19, and financial inclusion.

Her publications cover areas such as Islamic FinTech, access to bank credit and firm innovation, artificial intelligence in economic growth, and the impact of digitalization on energy consumption. She is a native Arabic speaker and proficient in English.
